Beyond our monthly public forums, we have also introduced Model UN programs to 39 Orlando-area schools where high school and middle school students adopt the roles of delegates to the United Nations during our training workshops and mini-conferences.

We are also building a college internship program and K-12 Bright Futures Community Service program where we have been designing activities for students based on their own individual goals and interests.

For our August 2018 meeting we will hold a meeting that will include a Model UN training workshop and begin preparations for participation in the KnightMUN conference that will take place at UCF in October.
